FEBRUARY EMPHASIS - TIME OF FAST

As you know well, TOF funds have been raised by club members for going a meal or two and donating the corresponding price of that meal to the program. AP targets 2024-25 is 45,000CHF.

With the coordination with the World Alliance of YMCAs and its National branches, educated and self-help projects have been funded in many countries.

During the term of 2024-25, there are 8 projects were approved as 2024-25 TOF projects including 'Dealing with Students who cannot attend school for long period (CHF15,000) applied by Japan East Region. Recent years, there are few applications from ASP Area.

TOF initiatives must align with at least one of 17 SDGs of the United Nations. 5,000CHF can be made available per event with a maximum of 15,000CHF.

TIME OF FAST PROJECT (2024-2027) FOR "FUTOHKO" IN JAPAN

Project Background

There are over 340,000 students in grade and middle schools who do not attend their schools for more than a month for various reasons. It is said that one or two in every class in grade schools and 2 to 3 in every middle school class are not attending their schools presently in Japan. The number of those Futohko students has been increasing gradually in most of the areas in Japan. This is unique trend in Japan and it happens regardless of their family status, physical or mental disorders, or intelligence levels. Many psychologists found that this is not categorized in any disease but there could be a cultural or social trend behind the phenomena. This is a growing concern and therefore it draws attention among many parents and school teachers. This TOF project will be done in the region of Japan East by forming special teams in three YMCAs with the cooperation of Y's Men clubs of the same area. We may have different approaches to deal with Futohko cases and we encourage many Y's Men to be involved with other volunteers.

Project Activities

We need to organize various seminars and visit on-going programs in order to help those students to find themselves through encouragement. We must learn how to deal with those Futohko students and their sensitive issues by studying various cases. This project will take three years. The first year is to find interested people from colleges or volunteers through various lectures and discussions. We would offer many kinds of opportunities to several YMCAs in cooperation with their Y's Men's Clubs. The second year is to start some projects and events on small scale and expand these trials in three YMCAs and involving some other local organizations. Meanwhile we provide various opportunities to learn and visit those successful approaches toward Futohko cases. By the end of the third year, we expect good understanding of Futohko situations and hope to have good cooperative relationship with the Futohko supporting groups. We would hope these challenges and experiences would encourage the understandings of Y's Men's Club movement in Japan.

MY VISITING NEPAL AS BF DELEGATE

For one week, I had classes at this school every day. I taught two kinds of classes: an origami class and an understanding-Japan class. They enjoyed my classes very much. I wish I could visit again.

In Lumbini, IPRD Deepak took me to two wedding ceremonies, a Hindi pilgrimage site, his relatives' houses and local food restaurants. Everything was a fresh and wonderful experience for me. Finally, I returned to Kathmandu and stayed there for a few days.

Kathmandu is a huge cosmopolitan city. After three weeks, I came back to Japan. I appreciate the Y Service Club members and every Nepali person for what they have done for me.
