COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

This a a kind reminder that the International Community Service Award will be closed for application on June 15 to 30, 2025. There are two categories of awards:

- Independent
 - for community service coordinated and executed by a single club
- Collective
 - for community service involving multiple clubs at the District, Region or Area level.

Applications must:

- 1. Include at least one photo or video of the community service project in progress
- 2. Represent one project or activity
- 3. Directly assist or serve a marginalised population
- 4. Be coordinated and executed primarily by the applicant
- 5. Count at least 20 or more direct beneficiaries

6. Involve at least 20% of the implementing club members in some capacity Applications will be reviewed and ranked by the IEOs with the cooperation of the ISD Community Service between 15 June and 30 June each year. Results will be announced in conjunction with Legistrative Assembly Representative.

YOUTH EMPOWERMENT YOUTH ACTIONS IN JAPAN

As one of the Youth Empowerment projects, both Y's Men Japan West and Japan East and all Japan YMCAs gathered and started the new project, called Youth Action. There are 34 YMCAs and 72 YM clubs in Japan West and 51 clubs in Japan East Regions. The first Youth Action was held in 2022-23 with 10 actions groups of young people, and we have just completed the second Youth Actions of 10 groups in 2024-25. The second projects were completed and they made the final reporting session by Zoom in March 2025. All those projects were proposed by youth groups for improving the SDGs (UN Sustainable Development Goals) in their communities. (picture below)

The 36th Youth Volunteer Leaders` Forum

This activity was created in 1998 and youth leaders of YMCAs were invited in September for three days in YMCA campsite near Mt. Fuji. This was started to support youth volunteers of YMCAs. The main theme was to learn what we could do for Futohko students (who do not attend schools for some reasons). This issue has been a growing concern for many Grade and Middle schools in Japan. A new project proposal was submitted to the TOF funds in March 2024 and was funded as a three year plan of actions in Japan East Region for developing new projects for Futohko students. It was started in two YMCAs so far, Yamanashi YMCA and Tochigi YMCA.

Encouraging Community Service projects

In order to increase new members of Y's Men's Clubs, we need to clearly show our purposes of the YM movement. Encouraging the Community Service Activities by 51 clubs, 7 Districts and Japan East Region could be one way to do so. Actually, some clubs have conducted very impressive CS activities for 10-20 years continuously. However, these activities need to be more known to their communities. One action was to introduce and discuss those impressive activities by conducting Night Forums introducing 9 main activities in three months. Over 100 people had watched those activities through zoom.

Confronting the realities of Y`s Men movement of Japan East Region

This is the time of shifting our movement as many other Social Organizations are also facing in the last few decades. Society has been changing and our future directions of the YMI movement should be readjusted to attract younger men and women in each area. We have been discussing many issues structures and purposes of our activities.

The Morioka YMCA Youth, challenging to the Youth Action in 24-25 was awarded for the best practice in Japan YMCA Conference. Their theme was teaching Human Right to children by playing a traditional card game.
